<u>Homework</u>

<u>English</u>

This term we will focus on:

- Story writing.
- Writing non-fiction texts with appropriate features and vocabulary.
- Reading myths and writing our own version.
- Play scripts.



- Instruction writing.
- We will also focus on paragraph construction and punctuation.

<u>Science</u>

Our science work will focus on:

- Evolution and Inheritance
- How living things have changed over time
- Fossils
- Compare and group different kinds of rocks on the basis of their simple, physical properties
- Describe in simple terms how fossils are formed

<u>Maths</u>

The areas of maths that we will cover this term include:

- Place value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and Division
